

On Holy Thursday, April 11, 1675, Father Jacques Marquette offered the first parochial Mass in the Illinois Country at Utica in the presence of 5,000 Native Americans. Father Marquette and his companion, Louis Joliet, took possession of this land in the name of Jesus Christ and founded the Mission of the Immaculate Conception. A monument in his honor stands in the northeast corner of the property. That mission eventually became the Church of Saint Mary. In 1858 a small frame church was built which was destroyed by fire seventeen years later and a brick and stone church was built. The Reverend Canon Jeremiah Moynihan was appointed the first resident pastor in 1884. The Reverend Francis J. O'Reilly succeeded Canon Moynihan in 1888 and in the same year erected the present church. In September 1986, Saint Mary's Church was completely redecorated. Though damaged, it survived the Utica tornado of 2004 and was quickly restored.

Gospel Meditation for September 14th

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him...might have eternal life.

This verse from the Gospel of John may be the most famous passage in the whole Bible. It's especially appropriate on this feast of the Exaltation of the Cross because it's a concise summary of why the cross of Christ is central to our faith. Let's reflect on it today.

Love. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son". God is a communion of three Persons, with a love and unity beyond our comprehension. Yet this triune God so desired to share his perfect love with us that the Son of God became a man. Out of that love, Jesus was willing to suffer and die on the cross—all so that he could save us. This love is so immense; it knows no bounds. It will go to any lengths and give everything to bring us into God's loving embrace.

Life. "...so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life". God never wanted us to die. In Adam, we brought death upon ourselves when we turned away from God and went our own way. But on the cross, Jesus offered himself up as "expiation for our sins". Through the shedding of his blood, Jesus conquered sin and death for everyone. This means that we can begin to experience eternal life even now. We don't have to be slaves to sin, and we don't have to fear death! When we do sin, the Holy Spirit can assure us of God's mercy and forgiveness. And now, we can look forward in hope to life everlasting in his presence.

Love and Life: this is the message of the cross. Today at Mass, gaze at the cross, and thank God for all that he has done for you in Christ Jesus, Our Lord!

"Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, may the cross always remind me of your overflowing love for me."






Crossword. Gospel from Exaltation of the Cross.
