

On Holy Thursday, April 11, 1675, Father Jacques Marquette offered the first parochial Mass in the Illinois Country at Utica in the presence of 5,000 Native Americans. Father Marquette and his companion, Louis Joliet, took possession of this land in the name of Jesus Christ and founded the Mission of the Immaculate Conception. A monument in his honor stands in the northeast corner of the property. That mission eventually became the Church of Saint Mary. In 1858 a small frame church was built which was destroyed by fire seventeen years later and a brick and stone church was built. The Reverend Canon Jeremiah Moynihan was appointed the first resident pastor in 1884. The Reverend Francis J. O'Reilly succeeded Canon Moynihan in 1888 and in the same year erected the present church. In September 1986, Saint Mary's Church was completely redecorated. Though damaged, it survived the Utica tornado of 2004 and was quickly restored.

Gospel Meditation for August 3rd

One's life does not consist of possessions.

"You can't take it with you." This common expression might be a good way to sum up Jesus' parable in today's Gospel. The landowner had been blessed with a bountiful harvest, so he decided to build larger barns to store his grain. Then he planned a great retirement for himself. But God told him that he would die that very night, "and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?"

It can be so tempting to believe that our lives consist of our possessions. It's easy to succumb to the constant allure of new "toys" that appear on the market almost daily. The problem is that our desire to fill our lives with more possessions can overshadow our desire for God. We can find ourselves thinking more often about the next "thing" to buy than about our much more pressing need to draw close to God and care for his children in need.

The remedy is not to give away all our possessions—that's not what Jesus is asking of us. But he does want us to be aware of how much time and money we spend searching for and acquiring new "treasures" for ourselves. Even more, he wants us to recognize how this crowds out the time and resources we could spend on being "rich in what matters to God."

Everything we have is a gift from God. The man's bountiful harvest was a gift as well. Instead of trying to store up his grain so that he could "rest, eat, drink, and be merry," he could have blessed those who were less fortunate. In the same way, we can ask ourselves, "How can I reflect God's generosity and share more of my blessings with people in need?" It may mean buying or shopping less; it may mean giving more to people who truly need it. This may not be easy, but it will make us eternally rich in what matters to God!

"Jesus, help me to be generous with all you have given me!"






