

On Holy Thursday, April 11, 1675, Father Jacques Marquette offered the first parochial Mass in the Illinois Country at Utica in the presence of 5,000 Native Americans. Father Marquette and his companion, Louis Joliet, took possession of this land in the name of Jesus Christ and founded the Mission of the Immaculate Conception. A monument in his honor stands in the northeast corner of the property. That mission eventually became the Church of Saint Mary. In 1858 a small frame church was built which was destroyed by fire seventeen years later and a brick and stone church was built. The Reverend Canon Jeremiah Moynihan was appointed the first resident pastor in 1884. The Reverend Francis J. O'Reilly succeeded Canon Moynihan in 1888 and in the same year erected the present church. In September 1986, Saint Mary's Church was completely redecorated. Though damaged, it survived the Utica tornado of 2004 and was quickly restored.

Gospel Meditation for May 11th

The Lamb...will shepherd them.

Have you ever heard of a lamb that was also a shepherd? Today's second reading tells us that Jesus, the Lamb of God, will shepherd the saints who stand before the heavenly throne. Although this Lamb still bears the wounds of his sacrifice, he will protect the saints, lead them to life-giving water, and wipe away their tears. How odd!

Actually, it's not so odd. Jesus, the Lamb of God, is a perfect shepherd for us. Here's why:

- This Lamb is a shepherd who lived his life completely obedient to the will of his Father. Every moment, he united himself with God's will. He alone perfectly walked in the path of righteousness, so of course he knows how to lead us on the same path!
- This Lamb is a shepherd who defeated the powers of darkness through his humble self-offering. He freely handed himself over to death on the cross. When he rose from the dead, he defeated sin and death! He is uniquely able to protect us in the face of whatever trouble or foe comes our way.
- This Lamb is a shepherd who poured out his own blood on the cross to cleanse us from all impurity. The water that flowed from his pierced side is the living water of Baptism and new life. It is to this life-giving water that he leads us.
- This Lamb is a shepherd who has suffered in every way we have. He embraced our weakness and frailty. His experience of sorrow makes him all the more attentive to our own, and he tenderly wipes away our tears.

As you celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday today, spend some time considering Jesus, the Lamb who is your shepherd. Rejoice that he has not left you to make your way on this journey alone. He has gone before you, and he will lead you home.

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage: The legacy of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage continues in 2025 with another historic cross-country journey... The St. Katherine Drexel route. This time, we're beginning in Indianapolis, the location of the 10th National Eucharistic Congress last summer, and we're going all the way to Los Angeles.

A Journey WITH Jesus: Jesus desires to accompany us in life, not just spiritually but physically through the Eucharist. By giving us the Eucharist, Jesus made it possible for all believers—not just those in the first century—to walk with him. Catholic Eucharistic processions continue this tradition, allowing the faithful to publicly accompany Jesus and help others encounter him personally.

Be a part of the journey!: Join us for another historic moment of grace as we walk with Jesus. The Blessed Sacrament will be in our diocese for 3 days (May 19-21).

May 19th: Bishop Tylka will receive Our Eucharistic Lord from Bishop Hicks (Joliet Diocese) at St. Patrick Church, Seneca at 2:00 p.m.

The pilgrimage will then journey to St. Mary Church, Utica, where from 3:30-4:00 p.m. we will offer prayers, bible readings, songs, and time for adoration. The Eucharistic Procession will enter our parish grounds from Washington Street. We will gather around the Fr. Marquette statue (weather permitting) recognizing the historical significance of our parish to the Illinois Valley. Fr. Marquette first celebrated Mass here within the Diocese of Peoria 350 years ago.

Parking—We ask those in attendance to park in the south or west lots. Please refrain from parking in the spots directly on the road in front of the church.

The day will conclude with a Mass of Thanksgiving at 5:30 p.m. in St. Hyacinth Church, LaSalle. Following Mass, there will be a Eucharistic Procession to Holy Rosary Shrine.

We honor Mary throughout the month of May!

Our Lady of Grace—Mary, the Mother of God, appeared twice to St. Catherine Labouré, a novice in the Daughters of Charity in Paris, France. During the first visit, the Blessed Mother sat in a chair and Catherine knelt at her feet, with her hands in Mary's lap. Mary said, "God wishes to give you a mission." In the next visit, Mary told her to have a medal made to be worn around the neck as a reminder that God gives grace to those who ask him in trustful prayer. Catherine obeyed and a goldsmith made ten two-sided medals per her instructions. People all over the world still wear Mary's "Miraculous Medal" as a reminder to seek God's grace through fervent prayer.

Prayer: O Lady of Grace, our Spiritual Mother, help us in our time of need! Remind us to pray always with great trust in your promise to shower grace upon those who ask with faith. Obtain from your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, the grace I need most in this moment. Amen.
